## **English Language**

- 1. Based on our senior form students' examination results and standard of English, we arranged S.4 and S.5 students to participate in the English Gifted Writing Course so as to raise their interests in English writing.
- 2. English Week was conducted from 25<sup>th</sup> to 29<sup>th</sup> April. There were activities like lunch game booths, a book fair, movie appreciation and a Scrabble competition.
- 3. In order to facilitate E-Learning, the English Department has already uploaded online listening and vocabulary practice on the eClass platform so that our students may study at home.

#### **Mathematics**

Mathematics Week was held from 18<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> April. There were lunch game booths. On 21<sup>st</sup> April we invited The Census and Statistics Department to deliver a talk to our students on the Mathematical theories of statistics. It also enabled our students to understand the application of statistics in daily lives. Through various activities in Mathematics, our students developed more contact, understanding and appreciation of this subject.

#### **Liberal Studies**

- 1. The Liberal Studies and Extra and Co-Curricular Activities team joined various activities about environmental protection held by the Council for Sustainable Development so as to promote the message on the reduction of rubbish. We performed brilliantly in the activities and were presented with the Sustainable Development Participating Award
- 2. The Liberal Studies Department was cordially invited to visit the exhibition at the Ping Shan Tang Clan Gallery. The theme was Intangible Cultural Heritage in Hong Kong. The exhibition will be carried out from now till late June.
- 3. Chen Jing Luan of 4B joined the Award Ceremony of the 7th Healthy Information Student Ambassadors Scheme and its related activities organized by The Office for Film, Newspaper and Article Administration.
- 4. Students of Liberal Studies joined a Mock Legislature activity organized by The Rotary Club. Our students had interchange with peers from other schools.
- 5. Students of Geography and Liberal Studies joined the Ocean Conservation Scheme volunteer work service held by The Rotary Club. We helped promote the message of ocean conservation in Q.E.S. Old Student's Association Primary School and Chiu Yang Primary School of Hong Kong

### **Evangelistic Ministry Committee**

- 1. In order to develop our students' sense of belonging to their classes and praise and thank God with hymns, we held the Inter-Class Hymn Singing Competition on 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> March. There was a Best Interpretation Prize for each form. The winners were 1A,2B,3B,4B and 5A. We also held a Thanksgiving Concert on 17<sup>th</sup> March. The winning classes were invited to perform again to praise the Lord.
- 2. An Easter Service was held on 17<sup>th</sup> March. The Christian Ambassadors sang hymns gracefully. There was a Gospel Drama which delivered the message of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Ms. Tsang Man of The Fairview Park Alliance Church gave a sharing. Christian teachers and students sang together to glorify the grace of God.
- 3. The Leadership Training Camp for Christian Ambassadors was organized from 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> of April. 20 students participated in the camp. The activity was led by The Suen Douth Camp and enabled

our students to develop team spirit, achieve a personal breakthrough and overcome difficulties through the mode of experiential learning. In addition, our Christian Ambassadors appreciated God's will through spirituality and message sharing. They also built up a spiritual relationship with each other and began to grow under the guidance of God.

#### **Healthy Campus Development Team**

We held an election on 'the person I like most' in the spirit of "Love in Harmony and Proactive for Betterment" and a writing competition on the person I like most on "Love in Harmony and Proactive for Betterment". It nurtured a spirit of caring and proactive culture in the campus. It also enabled our students to learn more about the people who have made a great contribution to Hong Kong society. - 2. On 7<sup>th</sup> April 31 students from 5B and 5C joined a "Mr. Work Simulated Work Environment". Students played the roles of employees and endeavored to be the best staff in the company. They experienced the running of a working environment through the role-play and knew more about the requirement of the employers.
- 3. On 13<sup>th</sup> of April we led 13 4A students to visit Cathay City and observed their aviation technology and training facilities. Our students also learnt more about the kind of work and environment in the aviation industry so that they could equip themselves earlier if they would like to work in the field.
